**Wesley Enhanced Living Pennypack Park and Greater Northeast Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce Host Gubernatorial Candidate Sam Rohrer**  
***Third in the “Meet the Next Governor of Pennsylvania” series***

Rohrer’s appearance is the third in a series of breakfast meetings dubbed ***Meet the Next Governor of Pennsylvania*** which will feature the announced candidates for Governor of the Commonwealth. This series will give Northeast Philadelphia business leaders the chance to become familiar with the policies of the gubernatorial candidates and ask questions about what the candidates ideas are regarding key issues like small business development, healthcare and tax reform that will positively impact the Northeast. Community improvements at WEL Pennypack Park include new personal care suites, completely renovated and updated 120-bed rehabilitation and skilled nursing facility, remodeled dining rooms, a bistro-style restaurant, entertainment center, a new meditation chapel, library, game room, fitness center and courtyard.

Rohrer has served as a Pennsylvania state representative since 1992 and is currently the Republican chairman of the House Finance Committee. His outspoken support for constitutional principles has been the hallmark of his public service. During his tenure on the House Education Committee, Rohrer authored the historic Education Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) scholarship which has provided 33,000 Pennsylvania students with scholarship money to attend private or enhanced public school programs. Rohrer and his wife Ruth Ann are the parents of six children and three grandchildren.

WEL is currently investing more than \$52 million in the Northeast Philadelphia through the renovation projects underway at WEL Pennypack Park and WEL Burholme- formerly known as WEL at Pilgrim Gardens. Both construction projects utilize organized labor. The projects managed by WEL are aimed to improve the quality of life for income qualified and middle-income seniors and families living in Northeast Philadelphia and will help to bolster the local economy.
